Stream 1 (Services Delivery)

Strengthening support and referral services and reporting systems for women and girls GBV survivors



Stream 2 (Community Engagement)

Strengthening development and implementation of national GBV legislation



Raising awareness session on women's legal rights

Targeting **100 women** by conducting 4 sessions awareness to increase women knowledge in their legal rights and early marriage.

Broadcast community awareness about women's rights and the phenomenon of early marriage during conflicts.

This program discusses with the community issues about women's rights and the phenomenon of early marriage during conflicts by hosting women and men from with different roles in the society, such as: lawyers, judges, or civil society activists, to an open discussion and sharing opinions.

Monitoring and documenting to detect patterns of violence and discrimination against

women:



The process of monitoring and document is one of the most important tools that will be used to detect patterns of violence and discrimination against women, in the public or private spheres. **Determining the type of violence, its causes, areas of spread, and the identity of its perpetrators. Training of 25 participants** in the targeted areas to document the data in a correct manner so that it can be internationally accredited, overcome the lack of data and information, and validate the reliance on the main methods of documentation to gain credibility and validity. Increase the opportunities for pressure and advocacy in cases of violence and the possibility to determinate appropriate interventions.

Building capacity for police officers on the protection of women and girls

Targeting **30 police** officers working on gender equality issues by providing training on women protection according to the International Humanitarian Law.



Providing psychological and social support for GBV survivor

Providing 300 psychological and social support sessions for GBV survivor.
