#### Vision and mission

# **Capacity building trainings**

Workshop on: Gender equality, in peacebuilding and gender transformation social change;
Mainstreaming positive gender norms relations in Yemen's peace building; Advocacy and
campaigning on Gender transformative social change for **120 participants** from women representatives
of CSOs, national authority and ministries, and others.

Workshop for Youth group coalition building and campaign mobilization and social grant Workshop to empower knowledge, resources, and tools for Youth-led initiatives, skills in digital and social media platforms for 20 youth, prepare them to develop a social action plan for GBV awareness-raising campaign.

# **Next Generation Feminist Leaders Retreat Training**

Create a safe space for **25 women** activist and agent of social change, building their capacity in feminist leadership, mechanisms and approaches to shift and change attitude, behaviors, social norms that perpetuate gender inequality.

Social action project grant for women-led initiatives, tackling Gender-based violence **Promote the important of women's role in the community**, providing opportunity for women to led 4 social action projects practicing and improving their leadership skills.



"Plant the seeds 4 peace" online media campaign platform and radio session

As part of the community mobilization advocacy campaigning, design, launching and maintain an online education campaign on promoting societal discussions on social norms challenges and practice that contribute gender inequality in Yemen.

National conference and women-led advocacy and campaign for a gender equitable society. Targeting 80 national and community member to promote a collaborative, coordinated effort in tackling GBV issues in Yemen, improve and strengthen gender protection and inclusive women participation.

## Art exhibition, Street Dance, and Dialogue sessions Campaign on GBV

Targeting 150-200 community members and 20 artists, prompting for collective ownership and responsibility to tackle gender inequality and GBV.
