

Develop two policy papers

2 national consultants will be recruited to develop 2 policy papers. The first one for the discriminatory gender and social norms at the local level; the second one for the results and impact of all the project activities (awareness sessions, community dialogue, lobbing meetings). A two-day launch event for each policy papers will take place in each district: the first day with the local authorities and social leaders and the second day for the women's civil societies, women leaders and women's initiatives.

Create a youth raising awareness team



Awareness raising session for community provided by the youth agents

A community awareness session will be conducted by the youth agents on Almaafr and shamayatin districts in Taiz governorate to transform social norms, believes, and attitudes on GBV.

The team will implement 14 awareness sessions, 7 in each district, targeting **280 people** from the community (with focus on the lower class in society, in particular mothers, fathers, grandmothers, grandfathers marginalize group, IDPs group)

Community Dialogue Session to raise awareness on GBV issues

14 community dialogue sessions (7 in each district) on GBV and other related topics will be held by the youth agents to social groups including teacher, social worker.

Production 2 infographic videos

Starting from the issues developed in the policy papers, create 2 videos to disseminate and advocate via internet in the Republic of Yemen in order to scale-up the raising awareness objective.

Activate and feed with content the platform 1325

Already existing platform for YPS specialized in advocating women's issues from the perspective of UN Resolution 1325. Publishing advocacy messages resulting from the outputs of the project – ideally by creating 4 messages per month during 6 month.

Lobbing and advocacy

Select 10 Community leaders (imams, chief of neighborhood, shikes, journalist, etc...) from Almaafr and Shamayatin districts. Select the most active participants from the launch of policy papers events to discussed the result of awareness sessions, community dialogue and policy paper and develop a future strategy for the further steps such as write a code of conduct against any kind of SGBV.
