Develop 2 policy papers

One on the discriminatory gender and social norms at the local level. The other to highlight the results and impact of the project activities. A 2-days launch event will be organized in each district with the local authorities, social leaders, women's civil societies, women leaders and women's initiatives.

<u>6-days training for 6 youth</u>

Training on gender issues and changing social norms with emphasis on SGBV with the purpose to create raising-awareness youth groups.



14 awareness raising session for 280 people of the community provided by the youth agents

Focusing on mothers, fathers, grandmothers, grandfathers marginalize groups, IDPs groups, these awareness sessions will be conducted to transform social norms, believes, and attitudes on GBV.

14 Community Dialogue Sessions to raise awareness on GBV issues Raising awareness session held by the youth agents to social groups such as teacher and social worker



Production 2 infographic videos

Starting from the issues developed in the policy papers, create 2 videos to disseminate and advocate via internet in the Republic of Yemen in order to **scale-up the raising awareness objective**.

Create 4 messages per month for the platform 1325

Publishing advocacy messages from the outputs of the project, in order to activate the already existing platform for YPS specialized in advocating women's issues from the perspective of UN Resolution 1325.

Lobbing and advocacy

10 Community leaders (imams, chief of neighborhood, shikes, journalist, etc...) together with the most active participants from the launch of policy papers events will discuss the results of awareness sessions, community dialogues and policy papers and develop a future strategy for the further steps such as write a code of conduct against any kind of SGBV.
